The Lighting of the Advent Candle

The Advent Theme: "Lord we need you." Advent 1 Sub-theme: "Come, Lord Jesus."

Reader: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God and the fellowship of

the Holy Spirit, be with you all.

All: And also with you.

Reader: The Circle of the Advent Wreath symbolizes God's unending love for us. The

evergreen represents growth and hope of life eternal. The four candles, one

for each Sunday of Advent, represent the years people waited for the

Messiah to come. And so now we cry,

All: O Come, O Come Emmanuel.

Reader: This year 2020 has been an unprecedented one as our entire world is held

captive by the COVID-19 pandemic and seeks to find answers to a lot of uncertainties. So much is wrong and so this Advent we cry more than ever.

Reader: The prophet Isaiah cried out for us, "O that you would tear open the heavens

and come down ... To make your name known ... so that nations might tremble at your presence." So tear through the mess, and make yourself

known to us, and so we cry,

All: O Come, O Come Emmanuel.

Reader: We light this first candle as a sign of our hope.

(the first candle is lit)

Hope that God meets us, even in the mess of our world.

Hope that God still sees us, though we feel we are lost in the rubble.

Hope that healing is God's eternal plan. Hope that God is the answer to all we need.

Let this light guide us to Emmanuel – God with us, as we cry,

All: O Come, O Come Emmanuel.

THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

The First Reading: Isaiah 64:1-9 (*Edith Kwamie*)

A Reading from the Book of Isaiah

O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence - as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil - to make your name known to your adversaries, so that the nations might tremble at your presence! When you did awesome deeds that we did not expect, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence. From ages past no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who works for those who wait for him. You meet those who gladly do right, those who remember you in your ways. But you were angry, and we sinned; because you hid yourself we transgressed. We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a filthy cloth. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away. There is no one who calls on your name, or attempts to take hold of you; for you have hidden your face from us, and have delivered us into the hand of our iniquity. Yet, O Lord, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand. Do not be exceedingly angry, O Lord, and do not remember iniquity forever. The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark

Jesus said, "In those days, after that suffering, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in clouds' with great power and glory. Then he will send out the angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven. From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the

Son, but only the Father. Beware, keep alert; for you do not know when the time will come. It is like a man going on a journey, when he leaves home and puts his slaves in charge, each with his work, and commands the doorkeeper to be on the watch. Therefore, keep awake - for you do not know when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly. And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake."

The Nicene Creed

Let us confess our faith, as we say,
